## Two Consecutive Season Streaks Highlight 500+ Teams

College football teams have seemed to have scored-at-will during the 2012 season; so, it was time to replace all the lights in the scoreboard with newer, brighter and longer-lasting-of, course, energy saving blubs. ©

Heading into with the NCAA II, III and NAIA playoffs this weekend, more teams will surely added to next week's Scoreboard.

Bowl Sub Division and the Championship Sub Division still have games left in their respective seasons.

Seven teams, from every level but Championship Sub Division, are amongst the early 500+ teams-headed by Oregon's high-flying offense that has tallied NCAA II Shippensburg which has tallied 548 points with a pair of regular season games, the Pac-12 Championship Game and a bowl appearance, remaining to increase its total.

The old cliché says: The must be something in the water. This could hold true for team currently listed as the second highest scoring team of 2012. Southern Oregon just 4 points back heading into this weekend's opening round of the NAIA Playoffs.

This is Southern Oregon's initial 500+ season; they join 3 other schools that have found the end zone to their linking-with more likely to follow.

To date, this brings the tally to 194 schools that have scored at least 500 points since Princeton recorded 645 points (in 9 games) during the 1885 season. The total accomplishments currently stand at 465.

The seven teams over 500 points makes it now 34 straight campaigns with at least one school reaching this plateau; and with Mount Union entering post season action at 517 , now has scored over 500 points in 18 every season since 1995 (18 total, in 1993).

Needless to say, the 18 is far and away the most of any active-and all-timestreak. Oregon is now tied for second with 3 straight. Defending NAIA National Champion Saint Xavier also has 3 straight-with an outside chance to make it 4 in a row with a strong run through the playoffs.
